What is Time for Me?

Time for Me is a program designed for children with an intellectual disability, ages 5-15, and that takes place on the first Saturday of each month. Attendees enjoy structured activities including crafts and gym time. A light snack is also served.

Parents have their own "Time for Me" knowing their children are in a safe environment, having fun and are well supervised by trained staff. T.S.S. are welcome to attend.

Sessions are fee based and are limited to 7 children at this time. Fee is \$15/first child and \$10/each addition child. FSS funds may be utilized for payment.
